



SNJB Selects Another Winner in 2014 Photo Contest

(Chesapeake, VA – November 6, 2014) The South Norfolk Jordan Bridge has selected another Quarterly Winner in its 2014 Photography Contest. Chesapeake resident Bryan Barbee got a little help from a helicopter when he snapped this aerial shot of the bridge in April 2014. Barbee's image, along with three others, will be included in a set of commemorative notecards and featured in SNJB marketing materials.

Accepting entries through December 31, the contest is open to anyone with a camera and a vision for great pictures. All images submitted are reviewed at the end of each quarter, with a winner selected for recognition and publication. After the final entry period, all contest submissions will be displayed during an Artists' Reception and open for People's Choice voting.



About the SNJB

The 5,375' long South Norfolk Jordan Bridge is two-lane, fixed span, high-rise toll bridge over the Southern Branch of the Elizabeth River. On the west side of the river, the bridge ties into existing Elm Avenue and Victory Boulevard in Portsmouth. On the east side, it connects to Poindexter Street and provides seamless access to I-464 in Chesapeake. The privately-funded bridge features two 12' wide traffic lanes, two 8' wide shoulders and a pedestrian sidewalk separated from traffic by a concrete barrier. A fully-electronic video capture system uses E-Z Pass to maximize convenience for users, but is not required for travel.
