South Norfolk Jordan Bridge Launches 2014 Photography Contest



The SNJB is an iconic new addition to the Hampton Roads skyline. Its sleek lines and shapely curves offer both a dramatic setting and subject for shutterbugs and photographic artists --consider its soaring silhouette at sunset, shimmering reflections on the river or the view from any vantage point of the region's tallest bridge.



A new photography contest is designed to inspire local residents and artists to capture images of the bridge for prizes and recognition. Beginning April 1st, images will be accepted for consideration in the 2014 SNJB Photography Contest. At the end of each quarter through 2014, a collection of up to five (5) finalists will be chosen and featured on the bridge's website and Facebook page. After a week, one (1) of the finalists will be selected and featured in a banner on the bridge's website and in its quarterly newsletter. At the end of the contest, all finalists and selected additional pieces will be displayed in a special public exhibition in early 2015 with a People's Choice voting event. The People's Choice selection and quarterly winners also will be published as a limited edition of personal notecards and available for purchase.

About the South Norfolk Jordan Bridge: The 5,375' long South Norfolk Jordan Bridge is two-lane, fixed span, high-rise toll bridge over the Southern Branch of the Elizabeth River. Connecting Chesapeake and Portsmouth, the privately-funded bridge also features a pedestrian sidewalk and sweeping panoramic views.
